

Style Guide

General Text

- > 1-inch margin on all sides (including footnotes and bibliography)
- Times New Roman font (including title, subheadings, quotes and bibliography)
- > British English spelling (i.e. colour vs. color, capitalise vs. capitalize)
- Pages are numbered sequentially throughout the articles, included on the bottom right of each page

Title

- > 14-point Times New Roman font
- > In bold
- Not underlined
- Centred
- ➤ If longer than one line, the break(s) in the title should not leave a preposition or conjunction at the end of the line
- > If longer than one line, it should be single-spaced
- Two lines between end of title and opening quote/start of text

Opening Quotes

- Centred
- Single-spaced
- > Two lines between end of quotes and start of text

Main body of Text

- ➤ 12-point
- Double spaced
- Left justified
- ➤ Block quotes (i.e. five or more lines long) should be extracted, double indented on both sides one-half inch from left margin, and single spaced
- > Subtitles in bold (not underlined)

Paragraphs

- > Indented
- ➤ No extra spaces between paragraphs double spacing only. Extra space after paragraph only permitted before a subheading
- > Paragraphs of reasonable length
- > To indicate a change of subject without using a subhead, type "
break>" on a line by itself

References

- ➤ All references follow MHRA format (footnotes and bibliography)
- > All citations in consistent format
- > All references cited in bibliography

Footnotes

- > 10-point
- ➤ No endnotes, all footnotes
- > One space between numeral and beginning of footnote (not indented)
- Single-spaced
- > Full stop at end of each footnote

Bibliography

- On own page (page break before bibliography begins)
- > Title centred
- > Title 14-point
- Alphabetised
- Double spaced
- ➤ No full stops after bibliographic entry
